Head Start

Head Start is a family centered child development program whose mission is to promote school readiness by enhancing the social and cognitive development of children through an evidence based curriculum, health, nutrition, and social services. Parent involvement in the classroom is encouraged.

The Head Start program is designed for families with children who are 3-5 years old. Head Start has 15 classrooms that are 6 hour programs with a variety of start times as well as an affordable extended

day program.



Early Head Start

Early Head Start promotes comprehensive early childhood development, and is family centered. All teachers in both Head Start and Early Head Start have a degree or certification in Early Childhood Development or Education to ensure quality teaching.

The Early Head Start program is designed for families with children who are 6 weeks up to 3 years old. Early Head Start has 5, 7 hour classrooms.
